All funds raised in this event would be used to pay educational fees of AIDS orphans in Southwestern and Central China and Central China.



Walk for Chalk

From November 7 to 9, Chi Heng Central China Project Site selected 20 students to participate in Chi Heng's annual signature fundraising event "Walk for Chalk" with volunteers from Hong Kong. During this three-day event, students, supporters and volunteers visited famous historical sites in Henan, and experienced the charm of Chinese history and culture. The students gained love and widened their horizon through interactions with the volunteers.



"Get cozy" Charity Concert

Chi Heng Foundation Beijing office and Jasmine, a volunteer of Chi Heng, held a "Get Cozy" Concert on November 23, which was the second joint event. Friends of Chi Heng purchased raffle tickets and charity items to raise tuition fees for AIDS orphans. All the money raised would help 20 primary school students to complete one year studies.



Chi Heng Beijing-Carrefour Food-collecting Event

From November 28 to 29, Chi Heng Beijing Office cooperated with Carrefour's two supermarkets in Sanyuan Bridge and Shuangjing, to hold a "Foodbank Collecting" event. Customers were so eager to donate food just bought that eventually Chi Heng received a total of 860 kg of food. Logistic company Best Express supported this event and transported all the food to Chi Heng Project Sites in Henan, Anhui and Yunnan at no charge. The food would be distributed to poor families, which provided warmth in the cold winter.



World AIDS Day events

On November 30, Chi Heng Foundation Zhengzhou Office carried out a campaigning event with the theme "Face AIDS, Eliminate Discrimination" in People's Park and Henan University of Technology, respectively. The main contents of the event were HIV/AIDS knowledge popularization, AIDS orphans' painting exhibition and charity sale. On December 1, the representatives of Chi Heng Foundation Zhengzhou Office went to Henan University, which has a history of over 100 years, and gave a speech themed "Chi Heng 10 Years, Happy Welfare" to more than 100 students. Through this event, Chi Heng not only spread the AIDS-related knowledge to ordinary people and university students, but also promoted the concept of Chi Heng Foundation. Moreover, there were many people who volunteered to join the Chi Heng team.



Chi Heng Caring Project

In order to greet the "12.1" World AIDS Day, on November 29 to 30, Chi Heng Anhui Project Site held a "fun weekend" event for motherless, fatherless, and studentless students, and students funded by Chi Heng Caring Home. These students got along very well with one another because they have the same background of loss of parents. Interactions between students, such as watching movies and ice-breaking games, helped them improve interpersonal skills and realize the importance of team work.



2014 Business Traveller Awards Ceremony

On November 12, 2014 Business Traveller awards ceremony was held in Shanghai Westin Hotel. There were more than 300 guests of the hotel industry at the dinner. Chi Heng has been cooperating with Business Traveller Magazine and many hotels for nine consecutive years in funding AIDS-impacted children through charity sales. Mr. Chung To presented awards in the ceremony, introducing Chi Heng's Education Program for AIDS-impacted orphans and the significance of Chi Oi Social Enterprise: Eco-bag Project to hotels and Chi Heng Foundation. In the future, Chi Heng would have an even closer cooperation with hotels.

Chi Heng university students in Guangdong travelled to Zhuhai in deep autumn

On November 1 and 2, Chi Heng Foundation Guangzhou Office organized an "outing for psychological development". A total of 17 college students visited well-known enterprises and learned practical interview skills, which helped students to have a career plan in the future.



In addition, students had a bicycle tour of Zhuhai, discharging youthful energy and vigor. Mr. Chung To participated throughout the event which made students feel the care from Chi Heng Foundation.

Chi Heng Public Welfare Talk

On November 5, Mr. Chung To was invited to give a public speech at Sun Yat-Sen University to more than 300 students. Mr. To shared his own experience of philanthropy, and introduced ways to make public welfare a way of life. The students' interest and enthusiasm to public welfare was felt during the talk.

The ENREACH information session

On November 22, Chi Heng Shanghai Office cooperated with ENREACH to introduce Chi Heng Volunteerism and video classroom projects to middle school students and parents in Shanghai, encouraging students to take an active part in social services. Students engaged in heated discussions, and they all wanted to participate in volunteer activities in their spare time.

Chi Heng Alumni Association networking and charity events

Seven branches of the Chi Heng Alumni Association, including Zhengzhou, Sichuan, Hunan, Hubei, Zhejiang, Jilin, Heilongjiang and Liaoning, held a social networking event on the November 22, with the presence of Mr. Chung To and 108 alumni. This was followed by a series of charity activities including care to the elderly, to children and the homeless, and the "Empty Plates" movement the next day. These events not only provided social networking opportunities to the alumni, but also deepened their understanding of Chi Heng.

Guangxi Students participated in an outdoor team building activity in Guangzhou

Mr. Chung To and 13 university students from Guangxi province participated an outdoor team building activity held by Chi Heng Guangzhou office on the November 15 and 16. The focus of the event was self-improvement and family support. On the 17th, Mr. Chung To gave a public speech in the Yanshan community of Guangxi Normal University, sharing his experience with university students and encouraging them to be involved in charitable activities.



The 2014 "WFC" forum held in Zhengzhou

The 2014 "WFC" forum, attended by 12 university students in Zhengzhou, Mr. Tung To, staff from the HIV orphan project, and approximately 40 volunteers from "Walk for Chalk", was held in Jianye Aimei Hotel in Zhengzhou on the November 10. The forum facilitated the further understanding of Chi Heng and its objectives as well as strengthening the belief in charity activities.

16 video classes offered by Shanghai office

In November, 4 video classrooms in the Chi Heng Shanghai office offered a total of 16 classes to Chi Heng-supported children during the weekends. Volunteer teachers from Shanghai provided a wide range of classes including English, drama, science and general knowledge, aiming to give students different experiences from their normal schooling. After one-year's preparation, the Chi Heng video classroom project has been greatly improved to meet the needs of the children.



20 home-visits in Central China completed

In November, staff from the Central China project completed 20 home-visits. The visits mainly targeted new applicants and students who were about to go to their next level of education, aiming to understand more their financial and psychological needs. These home-visits in Hubei were used as a significant opportunity to promote upcoming projects.

57 households in Hubei and Henan provinces given free rice and oil

57 households in Hubei and Henan provinces living in poverty benefited from the winter charity event held by the Central China Projects Team between November 25 and 28. These families were provided with free oil and rice as winter approached.



38 more students interviewed by the Central China office

The first 2014 autumn interview session led by staff from Central China under the coordination of different cities was completed on November 22 and 23. A total of 22 high school and 16 vocational school students were interviewed. During the interviews, students had the opportunity to deepen their understanding of Chi Heng and its structure and were encouraged to pursue their dreams through study.



Weekend Activities for Vocational School Students

24 students from the Central China Project participated in a two-day event, named "Walk for Love", from November 29 to 30. Students enjoyed activities including sightseeing, group games, watching inspirational movies and an award-giving ceremony. Such events encouraged students to connect with Chi Heng more frequently, and reinforced the importance of personal achievement through study.
