Leaders and Senior Executives from the Chinese hospitality and airline industry attended the dinner, which was organized by Business Traveller's parent company, Panacea Publishing Asia.

Since 2006, Panacea Publishing Asia has chosen Chi Heng Foundation as the beneficiary of their annual fundraiser. Students from CHF's Shanghai Young Bakers (SYB) Program distributed pre-prepared cookie bags to all the guests. Four SYB



graduate students introduced themselves in English and French.

All of them are wonderful success stories: coming from Henan and Anhui, their parents died of AIDS-related illnesses, leaving them in a precarious financial situation. They were sponsored by CHF to join the Shanghai Young Bakers Program. All of them are now bakers in five-star hotels in Shanghai, such as JW Marriott.

Interviews with Vocational School Students



On the 3rd and 4th of November, 16 vocational school students were interviewed in Henan, to see if they fit the eligibility criteria for receiving stipends. During the interview, CHF staff also introduced the Education Sponsorship Program to the students, offering suggestions in facing their current difficulties in study and life, and encouraging them to study hard.

Fundraising for AIDS-affected children during the Hengzhi Autumn Ball

On the evening of 10th November, China's biggest business networking website Hengzhi hosted its 2012 Autumn Ball, inviting hundreds of Chinese and foreign business elites to convene together at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, Beijing. Chi Heng was the sole philanthropic organization in attendance and its chairman Mr. Chung To shared with the guests his 10-year work in helping AIDS orphans. Meanwhile, CHF raised funds through an auction session in the evening.



Peer Education project completed with success

On 24th - 25th November, CHF and Marie Stopes International successfully completed a youth centred peer education session in Beijing, under its You&Me Program. The Marie Stopes International trainer, Nan Long, discussed the promotion of sexual reproductive health (SRH) with 24 Chi Heng volunteers. They explored gender and sexuality, HIV/AIDS, and LGBT issues. This Train the Trainer program provided volunteers with SRH knowledge as well as professional training skills, and has the potential to encourage more young people to engage and train in this field.



Subsidy for Children with HIV/AIDS delivered in Yunnan

On 1st-7th November CHF staff went to seven counties in Yunnan to deliver living expense subsidies to 78 AIDS-affected children. These counties are located in the southwestern part of Yunnan, near the Lanchang River border Myanmar. These children and their families live in mountainous areas and most of their household income comes from farming. Delivering subsidies not only provides them with comfort, but ensures that the children have access to more nutritious food.



Mr. Chung To Presented at Community College and Universities

On the 17th November, Mr. Chung To delivered a speech in the Benyuan Community College. More than 100 people, including students and graduates funded by CHF, attended this event. Mr. To spoke on the current situation of HIV/AIDS and AIDS orphans in China, and introduced Chi Heng's programs.

On 24th and 25th November, Mr. Chung To, conducted campus seminars for teachers and students of Hainan Normal University at its Danzhou Campus. Sharing his 15-year experience in philanthropy, Mr. To called for greater awareness of the situation of AIDS orphans. On the morning of 25th, Mr Chung To was invited by the Danzhou Center for Disease Control and Prevention, to meet up with some local HIV - positive patients.



Interviews with University Students and Welcome Party for Freshmen held in Zhengzhou

Chi Heng Foundation has sponsored the education of nearly 1,000 AIDS-impacted college students thus far. In order to put every donated penny to good use, each semester Chung To interviews newly joined university students in person. Family background, their household financial situation, and school location are the main factors that affect the level of allocated funds to each student.

On 16th-18th November, Mr. To interviewed applicants for financial aid in Chi Heng's Zhengzhou office. 56 students, mainly freshmen in Zhengzhou, attended the interviews.

On 18th November, the "2012 CHF Welcome Party for University Freshmen in Zhengzhou" was held in Zhichuncun. 37 university students and some CHF staff joined this event. Wonderful games and activities were prepared by the participants and the party was held with great success.
