Due to the remoteness of this area, AIDS-impacted people suffer from discrimination, thus opportunities to share experiences are important for the local children. Interviews launched on the application for tuition for Chi Heng university students

Spring is the time when Chi Heng Foundation launched nation-wide interviews for the application of tuition for university students. In March, Mr. Chung To Chairman of Chi Heng interviewed 90 university students respectively in Zhengzhou, Zhoukou, Guangzhou, Kunming and Beijing offices. During the interviews, local offices invited former Chi Heng

On March 15th, Chi Heng staff in Lincang city attended the 2012 Report and Feedback meeting on the assessment of AIDS Prevention and Control programs in Lincang, Yunnan Province. All attendees were staff from local AIDS prevention and control related organizations. According to reported statistics, apart from the rural insurance policy, Chi Heng's educational support to AIDS orphans is the most long-lasting program and covers the biggest number of supported children.

On March 17th, Mr. Chung To, Chairman of Chi Heng Foundation attended the Kunming USB for youth, and shared with these young people his achievements as well as challenges in his 15-year philanthropic career. On the morning of March 30th, Chi Heng Beijing office attended the "World City: Responsibility and Action Forum on Capital University Volunteers Service" co-hosted by the Beijing Committee of the China Communist Youth League and Beijing Volunteer Federation. The forum supported by the University of International Business and Economics. Ms. Kong Zhouzhou, the Director of Chi Heng Beijing office shared the work and philosophy of Chi Heng Foundation with the student volunteer groups from more than 30 Beijing universities, and called for more young people to join the network of university volunteers.

Harvard Law Students Visited Chi Heng Hong Kong

On 19 March, 22 Harvard Law School students visited the Chi Heng Hong Kong office. The students were members of the Harvard Asia Law Society (HALS) and were on a 4-day spring delegation trip to HK. The students



took a very keen interest in Chi Heng's work with AIDS impacted children in China. They asked many good questions about the children and their families, as well as the social and legal environment in China. Chi Heng looks forward to welcoming them to be volunteers and supporters in the near future.

HALS is the only group at Harvard Law School (HLS) that brings together students with a common interest in legal and business issues across Asia. One of the largest student groups at HLS, HALS is extremely diverse and international, with past and current members from not only East Asia and North America, but also from South Asia, Latin America, and beyond. Members include native and fluent speakers of Mandarin, Cantonese, Taiwanese, Korean, Japanese, and South-East Asian languages, many of whom aspire to make use of their language skills and international experiences in their future work as legal professionals.

Personalized Care from Chi Heng Staff

On March 19th, staff from Beijing office accompanied Xiao Hao and his father from Fuyang to see doctors in Beijing. Xiao Hao, a ten-year-old HIV affected child, was facing possible paralysis and couldn't walk by himself. No cause of disease was found in his hometown. After one week in Beijing, and many doctor consultations, the cause of disease was found and a treatment plan developed. Chi Heng has managed to find a local hospital in Anhui where Xiao Hao and his father can continue further treatment. Let's pray for Xiao Hao and wish him an early recovery. We would be very happy to see him run under the sunshine, just like other children of his age.

Home Visits in Zhumadian

From March 4th to 13th, Chi Heng staff in Zhumadian paid home visits to 170 people, providing them with 70 buckets of milk powder as well as providing living allowances to 95 people.



Each year, Chi Heng Foundation carries out twice yearly home visits to the grantees. The work is not simply for the sake of verifying information, but more importantly for bringing love and hope to those students and families. Through on-site communication, playing games, distributing study materials and other basic items, a mutual trust is established with the grantees, which makes them feel a part of the Chi Heng family.

Promotion of Vocational School Students Projects

From March 25th to 27th in the Henan and Anhui offices, staff members of Chi Heng Foundation's Vocational School Students Project introduced in detail the project content and working procedures to local



staff responsible for home visits and material distribution. The staff also shared and exchanged ideas on how to guide students to choose majors and schools that are appropriate for them, as well as on the 'do's and don'ts' when recommending majors to students. The Chi Heng Vocational School Student Project, through linking with normal and regular vocational schools, aims to recommend majors to junior and high school graduate students and dropouts. It pays close attention to the study and psychological development of those who attend vocational schools. The project, up until 2012, has introduced more than 90 Chi Heng students to vocational schools, thus providing more options for these students' study.
