2013 University Students Summer Work Program Back at Home

In this summer, 178 university students who are sponsored by Chi Heng participated in the Summer Work Program and returned to their hometowns. In this Program, activities included visiting sponsored families, organizing interest classes and photography courses, collating data of sponsored families, and taking part into the reconstruction of the earth quake-affected area of Ya' an, Sichuan. Participating university students visited families of about 6,088 sponsored students in Central and South-Western China. Around 1,254 students benefited from the interest classes. The undergraduates also grew and matured through helping younger brothers and sisters in their hometown.



148 university students from Central and South-Western China attended the conference. There were group discussions and summaries at the meeting, focusing on Chi Heng's development as well as issues arising from the program they attended. In conclusion, they made lots of valuable suggestions for the program in next summer. In addition, Chi Heng's team had a two-day team-building outdoor activity with the students, which helped to broaden their horizons and increased their awareness to the importance of team work.

16 students participated in the reconstruction work of the quake-stricken areas in Ya' an and Beichuan in Sichuan province. There were three main parts: (1) providing three-dimensional support, (2) organizing interest classes and (3) creating post-quake psychological profiles. Chi Heng students also organized programs to promote public welfare along with Chengdu Yizhong Community Development Center. The students gained experience in supporting others through these activities that demonstrates the philosophy of Chi Heng to charity work - "one help three and three extend to nine".

Charity Sale of AIDS Orphans' Paintings



2013 Summer Activities for Primary and Junior High School Students

On August 15th, the local TV Station in Zhumadian filmed the celebration of the interest class held by Chi Heng's Summer Work Program team. 40 primary and junior high school students sponsored by Chi Heng along with other 110



students attended the summer extra-curricular activities program. With a fun and effective teaching style, the students were put in touch with new areas of knowledge and their potentials were tapped. With its commencement in 2005, the summer mutual assistance program of university students has had 700 person-count of university students participated and 5,600 children benefited from it.

According to the data collected by Chi Heng's home visits, quite a lot of third-year junior and senior high school students had plans to drop out of school to work in cities. On August 19th, Chi Heng project team in Henan Zhumadian held a campaign to help these students to relieve anxiety and encourage them to continue their studies. In the campaign, the team talked to the students and provided counseling service to persuade them to reconsider bettering their lives through studies and mastering a professional skill. After the campaign, some of the students replied that they felt greatly encouraged and would finish their studies.

From July 20th to August 20th, the vocational school project team organized a small team of nine members to travel in Henan and Anhui, in order to help junior high school drop-outs to equip with practical skills. The team visited 403 students who had dropped out in recent years one by one in this one-month project. After the persuasion, 12 students have returned to school.





Chi Heng Summer Camp in Shanghai

From August 5th to 11th, 21 students from Anhui joined a summer camp entitled "Glowing Fireflies" in Shanghai. The one-week camp was supported by 6 social-caring enterprises, including Heng Yuan Xiang Company, BD, the Peninsula Shanghai, Standard Chartered Bank, Hugo Boss and Kempinski Hotel, Suzhou. All campers firstly experience the quintessence of Chinese culture - Peking Opera and hand-make a pizza. They also learnt some basic financial knowledge from the enterprise and visited Fudan University and Shanghai University of Finance and Economics, which let them know more about the environment in universities.
