DR. Ho COMES TO TOWN!

Dr. David Ho, creator of the groundbreaking antiretroviral therapy for HIV/AIDS and Time Magazine's 1996 Man of the Year, visited Hong Kong in September to speak at events on behalf of the Chi Heng Foundation. At a dinner hosted by the Standard Chartered Bank on September 14, Dr. Ho spoke along with CHF Chairman Chung To about the need for more AIDS education,

CHF Conducts UNESCO-Sponsored Research on AIDS-Impacted Children

The Chi Heng Foundation conducted its first wave of research on the state of AIDS-impacted children in central China this year, The project was funded by UNESCO Beijing Office and focused on extracting evidence and information on the progress and psychological health of children participating in CHF's AIDS Orphan Project. The Chi Heng Foundation hopes to establish this and subsequent research projects as the benchmark for research on AIDS-impacted children in China.

Students Take Summer Jobs with CHF

The Chi Heng Foundation hired 15 of its college students for the summer to facilitate its Home Visits Program. The students, young AIDS-impacted adults attending university under CHF's sponsorship, returned to their home villages to visit other CHF-supported families. They delivered nutritional packs, took photos, and talked with and evaluated the progress of the families on a regular basis.

As university students under CHFs programs, the young adults serve as role models for younger kids in our programs, demonstrating that every AIDS-impacted child has the chance to attend college.

CHF Sends 30 Students to New Vocational School

Thirty students in the AIDS Orphan Project enrolled in a vocational school for mechanics this year. The school is registered and accredited with the Chinese government, insuring that students will receive formal certification upon the completion of their courses. The initiative is part of a growing effort to provide training to CHF-sponsored children who no longer are able to continue with higher education.
